- 5. <u>Lack of communication or response to school outreach:</u> Strategy, address any underlying issues affecting communication to advice accordingly and guide student attention to various communication channels, such as emails, messages, or virtual meetings. Further, implement an escalation process for persistent non-responsiveness, involving parents or guardians if necessary.
- 6. An engaged virtual student is consistently isolated from group activities: Strategy, monitor group dynamics and intervene if there are signs of exclusion or isolation, and foster a sense of community through virtual platforms, encouraging social interaction.

1. Primary Level (Key Stage 1 and 2):

- Excused Absences (Non-Active): [6] school days per term
- Unexcused Absences (Non-Active): [4] school days per term

2. Secondary Level (Key Stage 3 and 4):

- Excused Absences (Non-Active): [5] school days per term
- Unexcused Absences (Non-Active): [3] school days per term

3. Sixth Form (Key Stage 5):

- Excused Absences (Non-Active): [4] school days per term
- Unexcused Absences (Non-Active): [2] school days per term

Reporting Absences: Parents or guardians are required to report absences promptly through the designated online attendance reporting system. In the case of foreseeable absences, advance notice is encouraged.

Documentation for Excused Absences: For excused absences, supporting documentation (e.g., medical certificates) may be required, especially for extended periods of absence.

9. Policy Review:
